Chairman Peter Welch sadly passed away on 17<sup>th</sup> July 2017, following a short illness.

Peter became aware of the work done by the Torbay Hospital League of Friends through his membership of Rotary and, having sampled a couple of meetings, was subsequently co-opted onto the Management Committee in early 2014.

A few months later he was not only elected as a full Trustee but also to the position of Vice Chairman. Unfortunately, shortly after he had to relinquish that position as Elizabeth was not well and he needed to spend time with her.

Happily, Elizabeth recovered so that two years later he was able to return to take up his position on the Management Committee and was shortly nominated to the position of Chairman which he took up in May 2016. Peter brought to the League a wealth of experience from a varied and successful professional life both in the UK and abroad.

Peter's time as Chairman was as busy as ever with the regular work of the League in which he played a full part. His time as Chairman was crowned by the success of the huge Appeal to raise £1.6m to equip the new build CCU.

Peter always had a smile on his face with a mischievous sense of humour and was an easy man to get on with. He will be greatly missed by all Trustees and Members of the League as well as everyone in the Hospital with whom he came into contact.

# Refurbishment of the doctor's mess room, enabling them to sleep between shifts.

The doctors mess - this will provide accommodation for junior doctors:

The nature of training in many medical specialties means that people are often expected to move around hospitals. Many people choose to settle in a permanent location - Plymouth/Exeter/Torbay/ somewhere in between all of them and therefore may have significant commutes to get home due to the nature of the geography of Devon and Cornwall.

It will also be used to mop up those doing nonresident on-calls who do not have a room allocated.

Currently junior doctors are napping on the mess sofas, which are not for this purpose, also the mess in the morning is buzzing with people eating breakfast, preparing lists and having handovers, so this is far from ideal.

The doctors had found some of the facilities themselves but needed help to furnish the room.

# *Our next project we are helping to fund...*

#### We hope to buy 25 scopes, both for colonscopes and gastroscopes, video recording software server to be used in our 3 room department.

This will be of benefit to many patients. The League of Friends has very generously agreed to buy new video endoscopy equipment for the 3 rooms at Torbay, *the total cost will be £1.3 million.* 

The endoscopy unit carries out over 10,000 procedures per year and provides training for doctors from across the country.

The unit has led bowel screening (for 60-74 year olds) since 2006 and the bowel scope programme (for all 55 year olds) started at Torbay in 2015.

The new equipment will provide high definition images that increase the detection of precancerous polyps; allowing the removal of polyps and prevention of bowel cancer. It can also help early detection of pre cancer changes in the oesophagus.

The new system will include video recording and this will greatly help doctors in clinic and multi-disciplinary cancer meetings.



The League of Friends bought much of the original endoscopy equipment that saw Torbay establish the first endoscopy unit in the South West. We are delighted that they continue to support us with the most up to date technology.

# *News from the Hospital...*

- A challenging year

It has been a challenging year for us in Torbay and South Devon. There has been an enormous amount of change with development of new services in the community.

Although it is sad that well-loved community hospitals have closed, the early evidence is that the new services, designed to look after people closer to home, are working as they should at this stage.

All of this change has been brought about through the hard work and dedication of our staff. As our Chief Executive says, the task has been 'like changing the engines of an airliner while it is in flight', as the demand for our services has continued throughout.

We have also had to achieve very substantial savings over the same time period. Across the whole of the NHS money is very tight. We have drawn up plans to take out £40M from our cost base.

This degree of savings requires change to the way we all work. We need to balance the books against the need for improvement in services and maintaining the quality and safety of care. We are pleased that in spite of the financial challenges we have managed to achieve improvements in services.

We were delighted to receive the 'Good' rating for our Emergency Department and Medical Services that were re-inspected by the CQC after a difficult inspection in 2016.

We have also been rated very highly in relation to experience of patients receiving cancer care and for doctors in training. Our staff survey shows that the Trust is still a really good place to work.

It is really difficult to make investments in improvements in the physical environment of our buildings and in state of the art equipment that improves care for patients.

The support from the League of Friends helps us to do that. We are very grateful for their ongoing support.
